The lectures and workshops will be held at the Hotel Le Méridien on the banks of the Alster, at the Kampnagel Theater in Hamburg, in different locations in Berlin, and in Lübeck at the European Hansemuseum. Georg Mascolo, Eberhard Sandschneider, and Director Sascha Suhrke with his team are responsible for the program.

The Bucerius Summer School has always been more than just a high-profile conference. It is about building networks and
